In **EYFS** the children watched a video about the importance of talking to someone if we are feeling sad or unhappy. We did some role play and the children were able to say what the 'actors' should do. We also sang nursery rhymes as last week was also National Nursery Rhyme week. We had great fun recognising rhymes from song bags.

Y1/2 considered the meaning of kindness and we discussed how we could be kind to each other. We chose examples of this and made a display. We linked our Computing work using Scratch to this theme. We looked at qualities of a good friend, using a story of two unlikely animals, an elephant and a butterfly, who were friends.

A brief account of 'Cool to be Kind' week

In Y3/4 the children discussed which qualities they felt were important in a good friend. We used this to write a 'Recipe for a Friend', explaining why we selected each 'ingredient'.

At the end of the week, we linked this to some drama activities, which were great fun ! During Cool to be Kind week, Y5/6 thought about being grateful to people who helped them. They wrote some very moving thank you cards explaining why they wanted to thank some very special people. These included Mums, Dads, Grandparents and siblings. They also created posters to show different ways of being kind.
