

### Spotlight on Learning

This week, we hear from Mrs De, our Creative Arts Lead.

At Great Gaddesden School, Art is planned using the National Curriculum and we structure our long term plans based on a progression of skills. It is a broad and balanced curriculum ensuring a wide variety of diverse artists. Each class has 3 units to cover in a year and the children have the opportunity to explore and evaluate different creative ideas developing skills in drawing, painting, printing, collage, textiles, sculpture and digital art. Children build on prior skills and knowledge to ensure clear progression across the year groups.

Here is what each year group have been learning about:

#### **EYFS**

In EYFS, the children have been exploring the topic of 'Zoos.' Their environment has been transformed into a zoo and they have been focussing on the different animals that might live there. They have been creating a wonderful 3D zoo complete with animals, trees and different homes to live in!










#### KS1

In Year 1 & 2, the children have been creating African patterns and paintings linked to their Geography topic 'Kenya.' They have used colour mixing to create their 'sunset' backgrounds, drawn repeating patterns for their border and then added African animal silhouettes which they cut out from black paper.











#### LKS2

In Year 3 & 4, the children have been looking at the work of different sculptors including Andy Goldsworthy, Antony Gormley and Anish Kapoor. They collected and used natural materials from the local environment to create sculptures in the style of Andy Goldworthy and they are now using plasticine and clay to design sculptures using inspiration from a variety of artists.















Year 4 were also entered into the Dacorum Young Artists award this year.

They all completed some beautiful Easter artwork.



#### UKS2

In Year 5 & 6, the children are exploring 'collage' as a medium. Linked to their work in Geography on 'Biomes' the children have created some beautiful rainforest pictures using a range of materials and colours.
